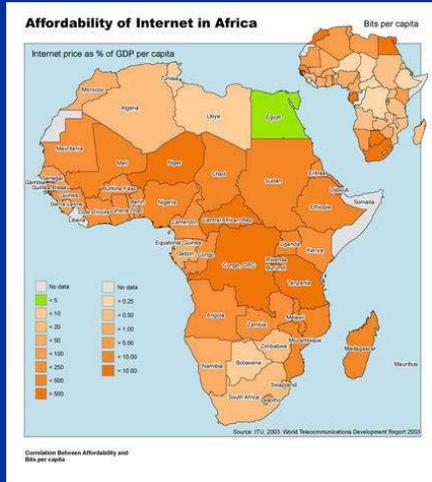


Statistics

- Africa only has about 3% of internet users in the entire world.
- Of the almost 44 million internet users in Africa, less than 1% are in Cameroon, Africa. This is a 1,750% growth increase since 2000.
- Less than 1% of the population of Cameroon have a personal computer.
- 4.6% of Cameroon's \$3 billion imports come from the US.
- Cameroon has a 30% unemployment rate
- 79% literacy rate in Cameroon

Project Overview

The College of Charleston's **Students In Free Enterprise (SIFE)** team is initiating a service learning project to encourage free enterprise in Africa through the use of technology.

The *Technology for Africa* project aims to promote entrepreneurship around the world by providing residents of the central African country of Cameroon access to computers and training on how to use them for economic development. Students will promote free enterprise by raising the necessary funds to set up three computer labs in the province of Douala and conduct training for future entrepreneurs.

Through educational, entrepreneurial outreach initiatives, SIFE students make a difference in our community by helping people develop a better understanding of how our free enterprise system works and how to use this information to empower themselves in achieving new successes. Students learn more by teaching others through the use of hands-on learning activities.



Labs & Planned Itinerary

Technology Labs

SIFE students will set up computer labs in the following cities:

- **Foumband** - 10 desktop computers will be used by students and entrepreneurs
- **Yaounde** - 15 desktop computers set up at Catholic University of Central Africa for use by entrepreneurship students.
- **Douala** - 12 desktop computers set up at Libermann High School for K-12 education



Planned Itinerary (March 2009)

- **Friday:** Depart from Charleston to Paris
- **Saturday:** Arrival in Douala
- **Sunday:** Travel to Bafoussam
- **Monday:** visit local governments, businesses and schools
- **Tuesday:** Visit Sultan in Foumband and set up first computer lab
- **Wednesday:** Travel to Yaounde and set up second computer lab. Meet with US Embassy officials and Ambassador of the Order of Malta.
- **Thursday:** Morning meeting with UCCAC University students for enterprise planning instruction and afternoon departure to Douala.
- **Friday:** Morning meeting with Libermann High School in Douala students and setup of third lab and instruction.
- **Saturday:** Depart from Douala to Paris
- **Sunday:** Arrive in Charleston
